

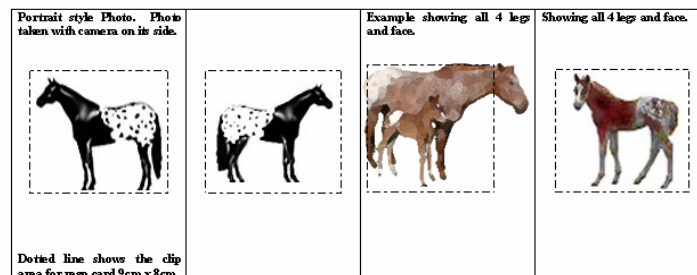


## Guide for taking registration photos.

No registrations will be completed unless all paper work is filled out correctly, your membership is up to date and correct fees are paid.

Digital Photo's are now accepted by the Society but they must be printed on photo paper. Please print these straight from the camera as twiggging of photos will not be accepted.

Turn your camera on its side and take a portrait shot. This has proven the best method of taking pictures that can be cropped to a size suitable for putting on the registration card. 3 clear photos showing all four legs. Registrations require one photo of the offside and two of the nearside, with at least one nearside photo showing the head. A side view with the head turned slightly is the best. Photos are cropped to 9 x 8cm so the subject must be able to fit within this area. **Leave the cropping to the Registrar.** Having the subject too far away is also a problem as too small a view doesn't give the Registrar a true idea of the descriptions of the subject and I think you will all agree it is nice to have a good picture on those registration cards. Getting the photos right the first time will enable a quicker processing of the registration, which means they get back to you quicker.
